Huntsville, Missouri), of Captain <u>George Demetrius Kendall's</u> Company I, 7th CA Infantry, died of inflammation of the brain from a knife wound in the spine received in a scuffle in the Company kitchen in the hospital at Fort Whipple February 7, 1866. (Orton, 791, 879)
- Private Samuel E. Wilson (New Ipswich, New Hampshire), of Captain <u>James Henry Shepard's</u> Company K, 7th CA Infantry, died of disease at Fort Mason February 18, 1866. (Orton, 795, 883) See his hard copy Hayden Pioneer Biographical File.
- Private <u>George W. Adams</u> (b. Howard County, Missouri), of Captain <u>Thomas J. Heninger's</u> Company G, 7th CA Infantry, died of disease in the hospital at Fort Mason February 21, 1866. (Orton, 785, 871)
- Private Jesus Anselma (b. Aconchi, [Sonora, Mexico]), enlisted at Fort Mason October 28, 1865, as Private, Company F, 1st AZ Infantry, was killed by Apaches [Yavapais?] while stationed at Skull Valley February 24, 1866. (Underhill, 16)
- Private Bernardino Escalante (b. Fronteras, (Sonora, Mexico), enlisted at Fort Mason November 3, as Private, Company F, 1st AZ Infantry, stationed at Skull Valley, was killed by Apaches [Yavapais?] February 24, 1866. (Underhill, 44)
- Private <u>James N. Barnes</u> (b. Jennings County, Indiana), of Captain <u>Thomas J. Heninger's</u> Company G, 7th CA Infantry, died in the hospital at Fort Mason February 25, 1866. (Orton, 785, 873)
- Private <u>John S. Webb</u> (b. Lincoln County, Maine), of Captain <u>James W. Bye's</u> Company A, 7th CA Infantry, died of scurvy in the hospital at Fort McDowell February 25, 1866. (Orton, 770, 883)
- Private <u>Roque Ramirez</u> (b. Magdelena, [Sonora, Mexico], enlisted at Tubac August 3, 1865, as Private, Captain <u>Hiram Storrs Washburn's</u> Company E, 1st AZ Infantry, was killed by Apaches along the Verde River <u>February 28, 1866</u>. (Underhill, 97)
- Private John Francis (b. Department of the Moselle, France), of Captain <u>Thomas A. Stombs'</u> Company F, 1st CA Cavalry, drowned in Gila River March 3, 1866. (Orton, 133, 874) See his hard copy Hayden Pioneer Biographical File.
- Private Solomon Boyle (b. Ireland), of Captain <u>Benjamin F. Fox's</u> Company K, 1st CA Cavalry, was supposed to have perished while on picket duty on the Salado Desert March 23, 1866. (Orton, 153, 872)
- Private Ferdinand Zimmerman (b. Mecklenburg, Germany), of Captain <u>Ebenezer C. Ledyard's</u> Company A (New), 1st CA Cavalry, died of chronic diarrhea at Fort Whipple March 23, 1866. (Orton, 97, 883)
- Private John Brien (b. Maryland), of Captain <u>Edwin Russell Theller's</u> Company I, 2nd CA Infantry, died of disease while en route from Fort Goodwin to Fort Yuma March 28, 1866. (Orton, 493, 873)

- Private Papat Aw (b. Pima, Arizona), enlisted at Pima September 1, 1865, as Private, Company F, 1st AZ Infantry, while stationed at Fort McDowell, was wounded by Apaches March 31 and died from his wound April 10, 1866. (Underhill, 21)
- Private <u>John Broderick</u> (b. County Galway, Ireland), enlisted at Fort Whipple June 24, 1865, as Private, Company A, 1st AZ Infantry, was killed by Apaches as he fished along the Verde River <u>April 20, 1866</u>. (Underhill, 27)
- Private Arthur V. Judd (b. Putnam [Township], Michigan), of Captain <u>Thomas J. Heninger's</u> Company G, 7th CA Infantry, died of disease at Fort Mason May 5, 1866. (Orton, 786, 876) See his hard copy Hayden Pioneer Biographical File.
- Private John Ryan (b. County Roscommon, Ireland), of Captain John Thompson's Company K, 1st New Mexico Cavalry, was killed in action with some Tonto Apaches at Skull Valley en route from Date Creek to Fort Whipple May 26, 1866. First Lieutenant Antonio Abeyta with a detachment went to Skull Valley and found the remains of Private Ryan and recovered the mail. The detachment returned with the remains to Fort Whipple May 29, 1866. (Orton, 106; Thompson, 752, 794)
- Captain <u>William H. Noves</u>, commanding Company K, 2nd CA Infantry, died of disease aboard the steamer *Oregon* at Port Isabel, at the mouth of the Colorado River, while en route to San Francisco to be mustered-out on <u>June 3</u>, <u>1866</u>. (Orton, 470, 498, 879)
- Sergeant McGill (his nativity is not shown in his compiled military service record), enlisted Maricopa Wells August 24, 1865, as Private and subsequently promoted Sergeant, Company B, 1st AZ Infantry, died at Maricopa Wells June 15, 1866. (Underhill, 75)
- Private Paulino Espinosa (b. Arispe, [Sonora], Mexico) enlisted at Fort Mason September 30, 1865, as Private, Company F, 1st AZ Infantry, stationed at Skull Valley, was killed by Apaches [Yavapais?] August 13, 1866. (Underhill, 45)
- <u>Leroy Jay</u> (b. Pennsylvania), late Private, of Captain <u>Henry M. Benson's</u> Company F, 1st California Infantry, was discharged at Fort Whipple August 29, 1864 and was killed by Indians between Big Bug and Turkey Creek, Yavapai County, while escorting a wagon-load of provisions to the Bully Bueno mining camp November 8, 1866. (Orton, 361)
