SUVCW Scholarship awarded to Brother Avery Frantz

The Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War (SUVCW) awards two \$2,500 scholarships annually for high-school seniors and college students, contingent upon their enrollment at an accredited four-year college or university.

Grant Camp Brother Avery Frantz, a student at Northern Arizona State University in Flagstaff, was awarded one of the scholarships.

General U.S. Grant Camp Announces JROTC Scholarship Program

Beginning in 2022, the General U.S. Grant Camp No.3 (USG3), Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War (SUVCW) will award, annually, a \$500 scholarship to a high school JROTC senior. The USG3 sponsors twelve high school JROTC programs. The scholarship will be awarded to a JROTC Senior Cadet from one of those schools. This endowment will be contingent upon his/her enrollment in an accredited school of higher learning. This new program offers higher educational opportunities to those outstanding JROTC cadets who demonstrate qualities of leadership, commitment, responsibility, community service and

excellence in the pursuit of education. The applicant must meet the requirements established by the USG3 Scholarship Committee and provide evidence of having accomplished each. A three-member Scholarship Committee is responsible for application review, selection and announcement of the winner.

A big thank you to everyone who participated. We will be delivering the items after the July 4th weekend.



Reports / Announcements / Business:

Old Business:

S/T Enlow gave a summary of the recent Department Officers' Meeting held via Zoom on May 1 of this year. Several committees were formed to investigate issues such as bonding of Officers, procedures for acceptance of new members, procedures for handling non-renewal of annual dues, creation of a Sons of Veterans Reserve (SVR) unit, and to explore alternate locations for a monument to Union Veterans 1861-1865 serving in the Arizona Territory. Brother Archibald, who could not attend, sent a summary of ROTC/JROTC activities to Commander Smith. He reported that 6 school JROTC programs are still closed due to COVID and that Brother Prater did present 4 awards in the USG3 area.

New business:

Commander Smith and SVC Prater gave a report of the very moving Grant Camp Memorial Day Ceremony at the Prescott Citizens Cemetery. It was well attended by Brothers, Allied Order Sisters, and representatives from Sons of Confederate Veterans (SCV), and Daughters of Confederate Veterans (DCV).

Commander Smith indicated that one of the Butcher boys had just undergone surgery and requested prayers and well wishes for all Bothers in need.

Commander Smith advised that Officer elections would be held at our October meeting and he asked for volunteers to step forward to serve the Camp.



Presentation:

Commander Smith gave a short presentation on Rock Island Armory and Civil War POW camp. The 12-acre POW compound held as many as 12,000 Confederate prisoners in weather as cold as 32 degrees below zero. There are 1964 Confederates buried in the cemetery there.

Featured speaker:

Commander Smith introduced our guest Speaker, Patty Palmero, N AZ Asst. State Coordinator, who gave an in-depth presentation on the Missing In America Project (MIAP). The mission of MIAP, which began in 2006, is to locate abandoned / unclaimed veteran cremains and to either return them to families or to give them a proper burial / resting place. To date they have interred more than 4,000 cremains that had been stored at funeral homes nationwide as unclaimed. US Grant Camp Brothers were invited to get involved and to attend their next ceremony, scheduled for October 7, 2021 at the Camp Navaho Veterans Cemetery.

General U. S. Grant's First Civil War Memorial Day Program

The Camp's first Memorial Day program—conducted for the Civil War Veterans buried in the Citizens Cemetery in Prescott, Arizona—was attended by Camp Brothers and guests from the DUVCW and the UDC. Twenty-five attendees paid tribute to the sacrifices of the Civil War soldiers buried in the cemetery for what they did to save the United States of America.

The program was opened and conducted by Camp Commander William Smith and the sequence of speakers follows: Verna Maleski, DUVCW National Chaplain, invocation; Tim Prater SVC, gave a very nice talk about Union Civil War Veteran Joseph A. Bryant and his short life in Prescott then in the territory of Arizona after the Civil War in his "If the Graves of Citizen Cemetery Could Talk" presentation; Dale Enlow, S/T recited the Gettysburg Address and talked about its relevance today; Richard Stephens JVC, recited "The Unknown Dead"; Tributes were given by: President Ginger Trokey, Margaret Warner Detached Tent No. 1, DUVCW; Brother Avery Frantz for Past President Nadine Arney, Thunderbird Chapter, UDC; Lee T. Nelson, Charter President, Johnny Reb Chapter UDC; Verna Maleski, President Picacho Peak Auxiliary No. 1; Benediction poem by Sister Maleski; and David Swanson, PCC, PDC reading of "Taps, The Last Call.

Memorial Day 2022 Citizens Cemetery Prescott, Arizona

SVC Tim Prater contacted Harry B. Oberg, District 1, Yavapai County Board of Supervisors to request permission for Grant Camp to represent the SUVCW in the 2022 Citizens Cemetery Memorial Day ceremony. Supervisor Oberg gave approval for Grant Camp, beginning in 2022, to participate in all future Citizen Cemetery Memorial Day ceremonies. This is incredibly good news as Grant Camp will now be able to honor and pay tribute to the 50+ Civil War Union Veterans buried at Citizens Cemetery.

It is hoped that with adequate planning and advanced notice, we can have a large contingent of Grant Camp Brothers attend the ceremony next year. We can also invite DSW Brothers and Allied Order Sisters to walk with us during the procession.

For those who have not been to Citizens Cemetery, it was built in 1864, the last year of the Civil War. The ceremony is conducted as though being held some 100 years ago.

A Standing Invitation to Join the SUVCW

SUVCW Memorial University

Brothers, if you want to increase your knowledge of the SUVCW please see the following information about its Memorial University. This course and the information gained from taking it is well worth the time and effort.

Go to http://www.suvcw.org/?page_id=1193 for information and to take the course. Be sure to read the directions at the top of the page! Upon the successful completion of all 12 sections you will receive a certificate of recognition from the National Patriotic Instructor—and you will be so intelligent that you won't be able to stand yourself.

Here is some information about it: “In 1900 the National Encampment of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War (SUVCW) voted to establish Memorial University, a college located in Mason City, Iowa. Its purpose was not only to educate, but also to instill patriotism in its students, and prepare them for an active role in American society. The University was closed in 1910. This portion of the SUVCW website is intended to continue this noble cause and to encourage patriotism, good citizenship and provide a basic knowledge of the American Civil War.

“In 2008, an education course for Junior and Junior Associates of the SUVCW was developed by the SUVCW National Committee on Americanism and Education and made available through this web site. In 2009, the curriculum of Memorial University was expanded with the development of an Officer Training Course for members of the SUVCW.”

Pierce, Arizona and the Pierce Cemetery




Co E, 7th Minn Infantry; and James W. Wilson, Guard at Confederate storage warehouses at San Antonio, Texas, Confederate army.”
