*This soldier may have been killed by Yavapais, not Apaches. At the beginning of the 1860s the Yavapai occupied an area in central Arizona bordering the San Francisco Peaks to the north, the Pinal and Mazatzal Mountains to the southeast, the Colorado River to the west, and the Gila River to the south. Hostile Yavapais were often mistaken as Apaches by American settlers, who referred to them as "Mohave-Apache," "Yuma-Apache," or "Tonto-Apache".
