Department of Arizona Grand Army of the Republic Early History

This book is dedicated to the soldiers, sailors, and Marines who served in the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, or Revenue Cutter Service of the United States of America and defended the Union and its principles during the War of the Rebellion, 1861-1865. As Abraham Lincoln wrote in his Gettysburg Address, "Now we are engaged in a great Civil War testing whether that nation or any nation so conceived and so dedicated can long endure." Because of their sacrifices our nation passed this test and went on to become the strongest in the world.

Early History of the Department of Arizona GAR

Introduction

This "Early History of the Department of Arizona GAR" contains the following information: Copies of Post information taken from the 1886 "Register of the Department of California Grand Army of the Republic," which contains information about the six GAR Posts that were eventually transferred to the Department of Arizona; complete copies of the Department of Arizona Grand Army of the Republic Annual Encampment Proceedings (which were only published from 1888-1905) obtained from the Library of Congress (these *Proceedings* contain a wealth of information about each post and the territory of Arizona); and information obtained from the Arizona Historical Society regarding the early history of these Posts in the territory; and finally a "souvenir" copy of the Fifteenth Annual Encampment of the Department of Arizona GAR held at Tucson in 1902 (obtained from the Northern Arizona State University library).

Many Civil War veterans in the Arizona Territory, like those veterans nationwide, joined the largest Union veterans organization of its day, the Grand Army of the Republic. The records of the Department of Arizona and its Posts are scarce and hopefully information contained here will help fill at least a small portion of that void. The men of this Department not only helped keep our Union together, they were also pioneers who helped with the formation of the territory and eventually the state of Arizona. These men and their accomplishments must not be forgotten.

The Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War (SUVCW), organized in 1881 and chartered by Congress in 1954, is the successor organization and legal heir to the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR) and the Brothers of Picacho Peak Camp No. 1, Arizona's SUVCW Camp-at-Large, are proud to be members of that organization. One of its purposes is "To perpetuate the memory of the Grand Army of the Republic and of the men who saved the Union 1861-65" and hopefully the information contained herein aids in that endeavor.

No attempt is made to index the information; I will leave that to another. The purpose is simply to get the information into the hands of the Brothers of Picacho Peak Camp No. 1 and the citizens of Arizona.

Department of Arizona

On September 10, 1887, six Posts of the Grand Army of the Republic, Department of California, located in the territory of Arizona, were transferred to the provisional Department of Arizona and on January 17, 1888, the permanent Grand Army of the Republic Department of Arizona became official.

The six Posts were: Negley Post No. 1 (35), Tucson; Burnside Post No. 2 (36), Tombstone; Barrett Post No. 3 (62), Prescott; T.E.G. Ransom Post No. 4 (67), Flagstaff; J.W. Owen Post No. 5 (83) Phoenix; J.W.S. Alexander Post No. 6 (95), Globe. Post numbers in parenthesis are the old Department of California Post numbers. Kehoe Post, at Bisbee, was also organized by the Department of California, but was not represented in the transfer (Beath: *History of the Grand Army of the Republic*, 1888).

By 1899 the Department of Arizona had reached its zenith with 11 Posts (although all were not active) by the following additions: John A. Logan Post No. 7, Tempe; Stebbins Post No. 8, Bisbee; Freemont Post No. 9, Yuma; Sedgwick Post No. 10, Williams; and Thomas Post No. 11, Jerome.

A short history of the Posts that were transferred from the Department of California and of those subsequently established in Arizona, all of which comprised the Department of Arizona, is contained in an undated "MEMORANDUM BY CARL HAYDEN REGARDING RECORDS OF THE GRAND ARMY OF THE REPUBLIC." [Hayden was an Arizona Congressional Representative and Senator.] This memorandum, housed in the library of the Arizona Historical Society at Tucson, contains information about each Post and was written "in hope that the members of the AMERICAN LEGION in Arizona will become interested in the location and preservation of the original records of another organization of men, who likewise served their country in time of war." The memorandum contains an invaluable early history of the Posts and as such is printed here. (The memorandum has Department of Arizona Post numbers in parenthesis.)

GEARY Post No. 25 Camp Thomas

Organized May 20, 1881 by Comrades John F. Fisher and Frank Staples. Kilmer, G. F.—Post Commander

Charter Membership 11. Charter not called for. [This Post was not transferred from the Department of California and the 1886 records show that it was then not in existence.]

NEGLEY Post No. 35 (1) Tucson

Named for Major General James S. Negley, who afterwards, as Congressman from Pennsylvania, sponsored the establishment of the Soldiers Home at Sawtelle, California.

Mustered in with membership of 13 December 12, 1881 by Comrade D. M. Riordan, late of Post No. 14, Bodie, [California—although there is no record of a Post there from 1886 on—Riordan is also associated with Ransom Post No. 4 in Flagstaff in the mid 1890's] as the result of good work done by Comrades A. B. Sampson and John T. Pantlind.

Toole, J. H.—Post Commander until he resigned prior to May 12, 1882.

Zabriskie, J. A.—Post Commander for the remainder of 1882.

1883-4, Miller, E. J., Post Commander-Hall, D.D. Delegate.

1885, Meeker, E. J., Post Commander – Delegates, Sampson, A. B.; Hand, George O.; Borton, Arthur.

1886, Hughes, Thomas, Post Commander – Delegates, Crawford, B. M.; Flynn, Matt; Speedy, James.

1887, Hughes, Thomas, Post Commander - Delegates Frazer, Robert; Brown, George W.; Kelly, R. B.;

Transferred to the Department of Arizona as Post No. 1 with membership of 47.

BURNSIDE Post No. 36 (2) Tombstone

Named for Major General Ambrose Everett Burnside who, as a Lieutenant served on the U.S. Mexico Boundary Survey, 1851; U.S. Senator from Rhode Island 1875-81.

Mustered in with membership of 13 January 20, 1882, by Comrade W. H. Seamans late of Rhode Island.

1882, Seamans, W. H. Post Commander.

1883-4, Grow, A. L., Post Commander – Delegates, Dibble, H. C.; Wardwell, D. K.; Howe, H. G.; Ward, J. L.

1885, Grow, A. L., Post Commander – Delegates, Stebbins, A.H.; Reppy, C.D., Rafferty, J. P., Earl, F. S.

1886, Reppy, C. D., Post Commander – Delegates, Watt, George R.; Oakes, George; Bartholemew (sic), C. E.; Kelso, John.

1887, Fickas, B. A., Post Commander – Delegates Achison, T. A.; Converse, N. A.; Bryant, Silas; Bryant, Stephen.

1887, Transferred to the Department of Arizona as Post No. 2 with membership of 47. 1901, Charter surrendered.

BARRETT Post No. 62 (3)

Named for 2d Lieutenant James Barrett, Co A, First Regiment, California Volunteer Cavalry, who was killed by Confederates at Picacho Pass, Arizona, April 15, 1862.

Mustered in, May 17, 1885, by Comrade Robert Fraser of Negley Post with membership of 37 and Patrick Ford, as Post Commander.

1885, De Witt, William, Post Commander – Delegates, Sines, G. W.; Guild, J.A.; Ellis, John; Guthrie, W. L..

1886, Tinker, George W. Post Commander – Delegates, Gosper, J.J.; Guild, James A.; Allabach, Charles H.

1887, Transferred to the Department of Arizona as Post No. 3 with membership of 51.

RANSOM Post No. 67 (4) Flagstaff

Named for Brigadier General Thomas Edward Greenfield Ransom of Illinois who was in 15 engagements during the Civil War including the battles of Shilo and Champion Hills and the siege of Vicksburg.

Mustered in September 23, 1885, by Comrade George H. Tinker of Barrett Post with membership of 15 with J. B. Smith as Post Commander.

1885, Burns, Louis, Post Commander – Delegates, Spafford, J.W.; Lockett, Joseph R.

1886, Burns, Louis, Post Commander – Delegates, Hart, D.F.; Spafford, J.W.

1887, Hart, D. F., Post Commander – Delegates, Gurthries, N.F.; Roger, George W.

1887, Transferred to the Department of Arizona as Post No. 4 with membership of 21.

OWEN Post No. 83 (5) Phoenix

Named for Capt. John W. Owen, Co. F, 7th Regiment, California Volunteer Infantry, who was in Command at Ft. McDowell, Arizona, 1865-1866. [Owen "was in command" of Co F, 7th Regiment and not in command of the fort.]

Mustered in, September 24, 1886, by Comrade Edward Schwartz with membership of 11 and himself as Post Commander.

1886, Knapp, C.H., Post Commander.

1887, Coats, George F., Post Commander.

1887, Transferred to the Department of Arizona as Post No. 5 with membership of 28.

ALEXANDER Post No. 95 (6) Globe

Named for Col. John S. W. Alexander, who commanded the 21st Regiment, Illinois Infantry, land was killed at the battle of Chickamauga, Sept. 20, 1863.

Mustered in, December 5, 1886, by Comrade E. J. Meeker of Negley Post with membership of 10 and Hampton Ellis as Post Commander.

1887, Allen, George A., Post Commander.

1887, Transferred to the Department of Arizona as Post No. 6 with membership of 22.

KEHOE Post No. 102 Bisbee

Named for James Kehoe (A.G.O. unable to identify him)

Mustered in, January 18, 1866, by A. L. Grow of Burnside Post, with membership of 18 and James F. Duncan as Post Commander.

1887, Shearer, T. N., Post Commander – Delegate, Grant, James.

1887, Transferred to the Department of Arizona with membership of 14. The number 7 was reserved for this Post but no mention of it appears in the Arizona annual reports except a statement by Department Commander Coats in 1891 that Kehoe Post was disbanded in December, 1887.

LOGAN Post No. 7 Tempe

Named for Major General John Alexander Logan, Representative and Senator from Illinois and Republican candidate for Vice President in 1884.

Mustered in, March 27, 1888, by A. L. Grow of Burnside Post with 14 members with Thomas Gregory as Post Commander.

STEBBINS Post No 8 Bisbee

Named for Asa H. Stebbins, 2d Lieutenant, Company D, 44th Regiment, Massachusetts Volunteer Infantry, who was wounded at the battle of Rawle's Mill, North Carolina, November 2, 1861.

Mustered in prior to March 3, 1890 with W.P. Long as Post Commander. 1894, Charter surrendered and 13 members transferred to other Posts.

FREEMONT Post No. 9 Yuma

Named for Major General John Charles Fremont, the explorer, who was Governor of Arizona, 1878-1881.

Mustered in, with 10 charter members in January 1891, by Comrade Matt Flynn of Negley Post and G. W. Fields as Post Commander.

This Post ceased to be active after 1902.

SEDGWICK Post No. 10 Williams

Named for Major General John Sedgwick who was killed at the battle of Spotsylvania, Virginia, May 9, 1864.

Mustered in, with 10 members February 23, 1894, and John W. Burrows as Post Commander.

THOMAS Post No. 11 Jerome

Named for Major General George Henry Thomas, "The Rock of Chickamauga." Mustered in, June 1899, with 18 members. [In existence for 14 months] 1900, Minty, R. H. G., Post Commander.

No report after 1900.

In a response to Carl Hayden's request for the American Legion to preserve the records of the GAR Posts, the Adjutant General of the Army stated in part: "May I suggest that a committee be appointed by each Post of the American Legion, located in a city or town where there was also a Grand Army Post, to make a diligent search for these old records. If found, Photostatted or other copies should be deposited with the Arizona Pioneers Historical Society and at other places where the original sources of Arizona history are being preserved."

When did the Department of Arizona Grand Army of the Republic finally close its doors?

Address of the Commander-in-Chief James W. Willett

DEPARTMENT OF ARIZONA

My comrades, the investigation of our records discloses the fact that for approximately two years last past the Department of Arizona has ceased to function. The membership has dwindled down to an approximate of 40 comrades, scattered all over the State, and there is no Grand Army Post, as I understand it, in any locality in that State with sufficient numerical strength to maintain a post. The State is one of magnificent distances, and the comrades are scattered here and there. We must not neglect the survivors of this department, and a way out must be found to take care of them.

I have examined the rules and regulations of our organization quite carefully and I have been unable to find any provision of said rules and regulations that will cover the condition of affairs as they now exist in Arizona. It will be observed that the provisions of article 10 of the rules and regulations, which provides for provisional departments, from a careful reading of same does not cover the situation in Arizona, as the provisions of said article only apply to States or Territories where the Grand Army of the Republic is not established in its departmental government. In this case the Grand Army of the Republic in the State of Arizona was established, and in a sense still exists, although the comrades have ceased to function in strict harmony with Grand Army law.

There should be an additional section 3, added to said article 10, which should provide for provisional department under circumstances surrounding the Arizona comrades. That is to say, that whenever the State department becomes so depleted in its membership that it can not maintain the requisite number of posts for the maintenance of such State departments, then and in that event a provisional department should be provided so that the commander in chief could appoint a provisional commander who when thus appointed would have sufficient authority, to appoint his assistant adjutant general, and quartermaster general, and such officers as we might conclude they should have, and such provisional commander should be permitted to function as long as they could muster within the State a quorum numerically strong enough to maintain a post.

I am not seeking to frame such a provision, but am simply calling the attention of this department to the situation, because I do not want to see the few comrades that are left in Arizona without just recognition in our order. I have assumed the authority and responsibility of appointing Comrade Dr. Warren E. Day, of Daytona Place, Prescott, Ariz., provisional department commander Grand Army of the Republic of the State of Arizona with power to act, and I have directed him to name his assistant adjutant general and associate officers in so far as he can, and have requested that he and the comrades, as many as can do so, come to this encampment and knock on its outer door for admission.

I presume that Comrade Day will be here with such of his comrades as he may prevail upon to come with him, and I hope that this encampment will take the necessary steps either by amendment of article 10 as suggested, or by some other method, to protect the interests of the few comrades left in the Department of Arizona, in accord with the principles of our organization.⁴

[It is not known if Arizona GAR Provisional Department Commander Day was present; however, Arizona was not represented in the previous 1922 national encampment, nor was it represented or mentioned in any encampments from 1924 forward.]

⁴ I am not advised whether there is any comrade here from Arizona. If there is, I wish he would call on the commander in chief at Hotel Wisconsin or here in this hall.
