General News and Information

Cpl. Howard E. Hoadley and the Case of the Missing Portrait

Earlier this year the National Woman's Relief Corps Secretary forwarded an email to me from Avery Frantz who was trying to find a contact for the J. W. Owens Woman's Relief Corps #1 in Phoenix. I told him that the Corps closed in 1956/57, all of the members are deceased and all records are lost. Avery persisted and the more intrigued I became with the story about his ggg-grandfather and a portrait that has been "missing" for over 65 years. That and the fact that young Avery is a 16-year old junior in high school and none of his family is interested in their very famous grandpa!

Howard E. Hoadley joined the 12th Indiana Calvary at age 15. By his 18th birthday he'd been promoted to Corporal, had his horse shot from under him at the Battle of Nashville and took part in Wilson's Raid, a 28-day, 700 mile march through Alabama and Georgia. After the Civil War, Mr. Hoadley became a prominent Phoenix citizen. He represented the Grand Army of the Republic as the Grand Marshall of several Memorial Day parades. He was the one of 4 Union Civil War Veterans from Arizona to attend the 75th Reunion of Gettysburg. The J. W. Owens Woman's Relief Corps Auxiliary #1 formed a sewing club and a thimble circle in his honor. They commissioned a portrait of Mr. Hoadley in 1942 that was hung in the VFW Hall in Phoenix.

Sadly, like tens of thousands of other Civil War veterans, Corporal Hoadley's service would be lost to the annals of time if not for a ggg-grandsons' quest to find that missing portrait.

Howard Hoadley was born on June 5, 1848 on a farm in Mahoning County, Ohio to Ebenezer and Deborah Hoadley. Howard was the youngest son and the 9th of 10 children. Howard had a humble beginning growing up on a farm but the Hoadley's were known as being a greatly generous family. Ebenezer Hoadley was an early convert to republicanism and worked tirelessly for the freedom of slaves in the south. During the Civil War he gave flour, clothing, and other necessities to the needy.

By 1860 the Hoadley family had moved to Richland Township and in December 1863, at the age of 15, Howard joined the Union at Angolia, Indiana. He enlisted in Company C, 12th Indiana Calvary, one of six companies under the command of Brigadier General James H. Wilson. Wilson's division was

attached to General George Thomas' Army of the Cumberland.

This Unit was organized at Kendallville, Indiana between December 10, 1863 and April 28, 1864. During this time they were outfitted and engaged in drills. (Drills were 4 hours per day) They played a key role at the Battle of Franklin when they repulsed an attempt to turn the Union left by noted Confederate cavalryman Major General Nathan Bedford Forrest. At the Battle of Nashville they delivered a major blow against Lieutenant General John B. Hood's left flank and then pursued the enemy after they retreated from the field. Corporal Hoadley would later recount that having his horse shot from under him at the Battle of Nashville had been the worst thing that happened to him.

In March 1865, Wilson led 13,500 Calvary men on a raid deep into Alabama with the goal of destroying the Confederate arsenal at Selma. The Selma Ordnance and Naval Foundry was the second largest supplier of war materials in the South, led only by the Tredegar Iron Works in Richmond, Virginia. It was the Civil War's largest cavalry raid, and final major engagement. After burning the arsenal and other military targets, Wilson crossed into Georgia and defeated a Confederate force at Columbus on April 16.

Wilson's Raid was a spectacular success. He and his men covered hundreds of miles, captured five fortified cities, 288 cannons, took more than 6,000 men prisoner, and killed and wounded more than 1,000 Confederates, while having only 99 men killed and 598 wounded.

The six companies at Columbus were eventually ordered to Vicksburg, Mississippi. They arrived on November 2nd and mustered out on the 10th of November 1865.

They proceeded to Indianapolis where on the 17th of November they were honored with a public dinner by the citizens of the city. They were welcomed home by a reception at State House Grove and by speeches given by the Governor and the Secretary of State Howard was not the only family member to enlist in the war his brother Sylvester enlisted in Company C, 111th Ohio infantry regiment on 21 Aug 1862. Promoted to 1st Lt. Feb 5, 1863 and 2nd Lt March 3, 1864. Sylvester was killed Oct 23, 1864 at Atlanta leaving a widow and 4 young children.

Josiah enlisted 24 February 1865 in the 189th Ohio mustered out in Nashville, September 28, 1865.

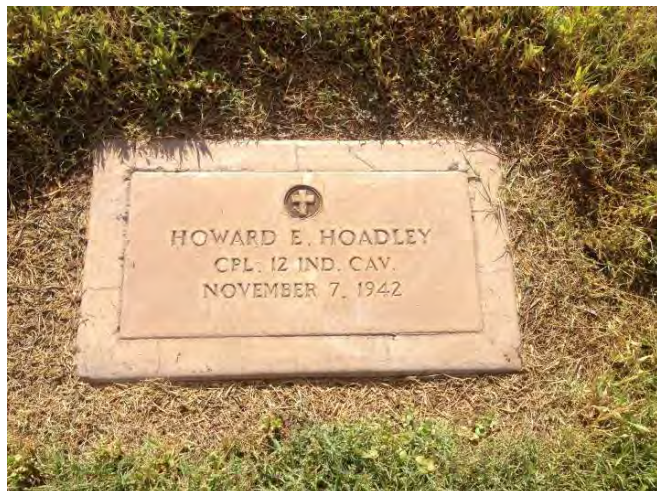
Calvin joined the 26th Regiment Illinois Infantry on January 1, 1864 at Scottsboro, AL, he mustered out July 20, 1865 in Louisville, KY

After being discharged Howard settled in Minnesota where he married Angeline Lindersmith on Sept 9, 1866. Howard and Angeline lived in Minnesota for about 15 years. They had 4 children in those 15 years, Nellie, Edith, Franklin, and May.

The family moved by train from Owatonna, Minnesota to Jamestown, North Dakota, and from there by oxen wagon to Grahams Island, North Dakota in 1880-1881 where they were farmers. The last two daughters, Maude and Effie were born on Grahams Island. They moved to Albert in Benson County where Howard purchased a General Store. In 1916/1917 they moved to the drier climate of Phoenix for Angeline's health.

After Angeline's death, his daughter Maude came to live with him. She was a past matron of the Golden Leaf Chapter, Order of Eastern Star and a volunteer Red Cross worker in both World Wars. She was an active member in the J. W. Owens Woman's Relief Corps and was the Sr. Vice President when they closed in the mid 1950's. Howard was a frequent speaker and guest of honor. She accompanied her father as his attendant to the 75th Anniversary of Gettysburg. Howard was the oldest ever member of the Phoenix Sciot Pyramid and member of the Mason Evergreen Lodge No.46 in Minnewaukan, ND. At the time of his death he was proclaimed as the last survivor of the Grand Army of the Republic for the state. However there is no record that he was a member in Arizona. He died November 7, 1942. He is buried at Greenwood Cemetery in Phoenix. Avery is searching for a portrait that was presented to him in May, 1942 by the J. W. Owens Woman's Relief Corps in Phoenix. It hung on the wall with other veterans' portraits at the VFW Hall in Phoenix. (Arizona Republic article)

Where the portrait went after the Hall closed is a mystery.

Official Site of the American Civil War...in France?

While this article was written some time ago it is still interesting.

In September 2004 the Civil War Preservation Trust (now named the American Battlefield Trust) named Cherbourg, on the Normandy coast of France, an official site of the American Civil War...the only such site listed outside of the United States.

True or False: The Battle of Cherbourg in 1864 pitted Union Cavalry forces commanded by General McCook and Confederate forces commanded by General Jackson in a head long crash of will and determination on the final advance to Paris.

Actually, 154 years ago the Union Sloop USS Kearsage sank the notorious rebel raider CSS Alabama in the English Channel just off Cherbourg, France.

The cemetery in Cherbourg is the final resting place of both Union and Confederate sailors.

In 1984 the wreck of the Alabama was discovered by a French minesweeper in 200' of water. An agreement between the U.S. and France was reached for underwater archaeological exploration of the site and so far more than 1000 dives have taken place. Over 300 items have been recovered from the icy depths and many are astonishingly intact: one of which is a sailor's meerschaum pipe still smelling of tobacco!
